GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS & GRADE SYSTEM

To graduate, **students must earn a minimum of 24 credits**. All students must complete American Literature, World History, United States History, Government, Economics, and Biology, Chemistry, and Physics with Lab. World language credits must be in the same language and taken in high school. Two 18-week semesters are organized on a 4x4 block schedule. Students enroll in 6-7 courses per semester. Year-long courses are awarded 1.0 credit and semester courses are awarded 0.5 credit at the end of the term.

- 75% of students participate in Honors, Advanced, Pre-AP, AP, and IB
- Dual enrollment options are available through the University of Miami and Miami-Dade College to students in grades 11-12

Gulliver does not rank students. The rigor of a student's curriculum and individual academic achievement is discussed in a personal letter of recommendation.

GPA reflects courses taken at Gulliver Prep. Transfer courses are not listed on Gulliver's transcript and are not included in Gulliver's GPA.

Weighted GPA is listed on the transcript. AP, IB, Pre-AP, Advanced, and Conservatory courses are given an extra 2.0 weight and Honors courses are given an extra 1.0 weight, which are reflected in a student's weighted 4.0 GPA.


