Gulliver Preparatory School, established in 1926, is a nonprofit, independent, coeducational, nonsectarian day school serving approximately 2,200 students in grades PK-12. Gulliver's mission is to create an academic community devoted to educational excellence, with a personal touch, that fulfills each student's potential. Upper School at Gulliver Prep is a time of expansive exploration, deep nurturing, bold empowerment, powerful personalization, pioneering entrepreneurship, and intellectual freedom.

EXTRAORDINARY OPPORTUNITIES AND A COMMITMENT TO INNOVATION

Gulliver Prep students have room to explore a challenging array of unique elective choices, in addition to both International Baccalaureate and Advanced Placement tracks.

- Gulliver's International Baccalaureate Diploma pass rate is historically above 90%, and 190 members of the classes of 2024 and 2025 are participating.
- Gulliver offers 31 Advanced Placement courses with a 70% pass rate.

By enrolling in six or seven courses per semester, our students engage deeply in meaningful academic opportunities in addition to their challenging core coursework.

Grade point averages reflect academic subjects plus the inclusion of any upper level visual or performing arts conservatory credits. Gulliver does not rank students, but does indicate the quality of their curriculum and relative academic achievement in a personal letter of recommendation. The following weighing system is used in determining GPAs:

Advanced Placement (AP).....	2 points
International Baccalaureate (IB).....	2 points
Pre IB/AP	2 points
Advanced.....	2 points
Conservatory	2 points
Honors (H)/Advanced.....	1 point

For graduation, a student must have 24 credits. One credit consists of a full-year course or two one-semester courses. The following must be included in a student's curriculum: American Literature, Biology with Lab, Chemistry with Lab, Physics with Lab, World History, United States History, and Government and Economics. World language credits must all be in the same language and must be taken at the high school level; lower level courses taken at the Middle School may count as prerequisites but do not count towards graduation. Twenty of the 24 credits required for graduation must be as indicated below.

DESIGN OF CURRICULUM

At Gulliver Prep, 75% of the student population participates in Pre-International Baccalaureate, Pre-Advanced Placement, Honors, Advanced Placement, or International Baccalaureate classes. College prep classes serve approximately 25% of the students. Students choose from a vast selection of rigorous academic offerings – more than 290 courses, including 160 electives and 70 world language offerings. Dual enrollment options at the University of Miami and other local colleges are available for students who wish to do advanced work and who have demonstrated exceptional academic potential.

International Baccalaureate Diploma: In 2023, Gulliver Preparatory graduated 69 seniors with the International Baccalaureate Diploma. Approximately 38% of the student population participates in the IB Programme, and we have a 90% IB Diploma pass rate the past 25 years. In the Class of 2024, 88 students are in the IB Programme.

SIGNATURE ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

Architecture: The Architecture Program prepares students for successful careers in architecture, urban planning, and industrial design. Learning 21st century future-ready skills, students research, create, design, and build. In addition to learning traditional drafting skills, students learn to design and build scaled models in physical and virtual space. Students become proficient in Building Information Modeling (BIM) and Computer Aided Design and Drafting (CADD) systems. Utilizing the latest BIM ArchiCAD software, students design and build in virtual space, creating renderings, animations, hypermodels, and VR export.

Biomedical Sciences: The Biomedical Sciences curriculum is designed as a series of four courses that give students a broad understanding of the careers available in the medical field. This program prepares students for post-secondary studies in the biomedical and premedical fields, including: biology, chemistry, and physics. Additionally, biomedical and mechanical engineering fields are explored. Students are also exposed to medical professions, such as clinical medicine, psychiatry, nursing, forensics, health care management, pharmaceuticals, and laboratory science. The program is project based, with students working in groups for the majority of the time.


Computer Science: The Computer Science curriculum provides the opportunity for all students to develop basic, intermediate, and advanced computer skills. The sequence of courses offered begins with those designed for proficiency in basic word processing, spreadsheets, and databases, and extends through courses focusing on programming and using advanced languages such as Cybersecurity and Programming.

Digital Mass Media: Digital Mass Media provides application of real-world skills through student-driven experiences in the areas of broadcasting, video, print, and online media platforms. This interdisciplinary program offers students opportunities to work in fast-paced, team-oriented, and deadline-driven environments. Students will take their experiences beyond the classroom as they work on projects for both internal and external clients. In addition, students who complete the program will have the opportunity to obtain professional industry certification.

Engineering: The Engineering and Computer Sciences curriculum makes math and science relevant for students. By engaging in hands-on, real-world projects, students understand how the skills they are learning in the classroom can be applied in everyday life. The engineering program is designed to give students a broad understanding of the fields of engineering and engineering technology and to prepare them for entrance to college and university schools of engineering. This project-based program, which requires curiosity of how things work, involves students working in groups completing hands-on activities, using computer aided design software, creating models and prototypes, and completing calculations for work, friction, efficiency, etc..

International Business and Entrepreneurship: International Business and Entrepreneurship is an honors-level academic program that prepares Gulliver students to thrive at a rigorous undergraduate school. The program fosters the personal development of each student by nurturing intellectual curiosity, problem-solving, academic achievement, service, leadership, and interpersonal relationships. Students develop a stakeholder view of business that emphasizes sustainable ethical behavior and an understanding of the value that our future business leaders offer society.

International Diplomacy and Legal Studies: International Diplomacy and Legal Studies has been designed to provide students an advanced level curriculum that introduces them to careers in international diplomacy and law. This is a one-track program that culminates with a senior year capstone course. The International Diplomacy and Legal Studies program will also meet Gulliver's CORE (Community Outreach/Raider Experience) initiative by enforcing the idea that all politics are local. Students are required to plan and carry out a community service project that benefits their local community in some way. The program's main goal is to provide students with the skills and experience necessary to excel in a college level course while also helping them focus their academic interests before graduating high school.
